North Lincolnshire Museum is a step back in time through fascinating hands-on displays. Learn about some of North Lincolnshire's amazing objects and stories.

EYFS / KS1 / KS2 Victorian Washday Blues

Curriculum links: 

Dress up in period clothes and use original dolly tubs, mangles and irons to discover what washday was like during the Victorian period.

EYFS / KS1 / KS2 Domestic Staff Required

Curriculum links: 

Meet Mrs Harding, housekeeper at the Hall, handle artefacts and see if you have what it takes to become a Victorian domestic servant.




KS2 Bright Ideas

Curriculum links:   

Pupils will be challenged to design a lamp for the 4th Baronet's reading chair. Pupils will handle a range of historical artefacts linked to lighting, placing them in chronological order and mapping development in technology.

EYFS / KS1 A Bug's Life

Curriculum links: 

Pupils will have a unique opportunity to explore the diverse range of habitats to be found at Normanby Hall Country Park.

KS2 Habitats

Curriculum links:  


Collect and observe a variety of mini-beasts in the woods and grassland of the Park using scientific equipment. Examine your discoveries and learn more about the need to protect the environment.

KS1 / KS2 Pond Dipping

Curriculum links: 

Investigate pond habitats by catching, examining and recording mini-beasts from the lake in this hands-on workshop.

KS2 Science in the Garden

Curriculum links: 


Work in the garden to conduct scientific experiments to learn about soil, growing conditions and plants.

KS1 / KS2 Woodland Detectives

Curriculum links:  

Explore sounds and habitats in the woodland of Normanby Park. Be a tree detective and learn about the plants and animals in the woodland habitat in this hands-on interactive workshop.

KS1 Changing Seasons

Curriculum links: 

Exploring the changes in the seasons and how it affects the plants and animals around Normanby Hall Country Park.

Storytelling in the Woodland



Curriculum links: 

Stimulate the senses and use your imagination in our magical storytelling area. Use our bespoke artistic creations and be inspired by the natural environment to share and communicate your ideas to the class.



KS1 / KS2

Stone Age and Early Cultures

Curriculum links:    

This workshop consists of two elements and can be done as a half day or a full day.


Stone Age Shelter building – discover how to survive 5000 years ago by building a shelter to protect against the elements. Hunter and Gatherers – discover what life was like for Stone Age people through object handling, role play and experimental archaeology.

Tag on forestry activities such as shelter building or fire lighting for a full day's adventure! Ask our Schools Business Support Officer for more details.

KS1 / KS2

Rural Life and Times

Curriculum links: 

Discover more about local farming during the Victorian period in this hands-on and engaging workshop. Handle real farming equipment and visit our replica village and cottage.



KS2

Axles and Wheels

Curriculum links:   

Explore the many examples of farm vehicles in the Rural Life Museum then create mock-ups of wheel and axle mechanisms. Using this as inspiration, pupils will then design and create their own toy farm vehicle.

The Mystery of Prehistory


Curriculum links: 

Investigate mysterious local finds and handmade replicas to discover how the people of North Lincolnshire developed through the prehistoric period.



KS2

Anglo Saxons Lost Kingdom


Curriculum links: 

Meet Ethelfreda and discover the art and culture of the Anglo Saxons in Britain. Examine evidence from a local Anglo Saxon burial site, handle real and replica artefacts and dress up as an Anglo Saxon. Children will also make their own illuminated letter.

The Vikings!

Curriculum links: 

Meet the Viking Helga. She will share a range of replica Anglo-Saxon and Viking weaponry and encourage children to consider which would have been the more effective in battle.

The Romans 🚗

Curriculum links: 🏠

Meet Julia, our Roman lady from Winterton Villa. Pupils will make comparisons between life in the Iron Age and Roman periods and enhance their investigative skills through archaeological sorting and examining evidence from Winterton Villa. A visit to a Roman market stall will develop an enthusiasm for weird and wonderful Roman foods, including dormice!



KS2

Linking the Localities

Curriculum links: 🏠

A local history workshop that provides pupils with evidence for a study of the local area prehistory onwards. Pupils will explore primary and secondary resources as they delve into their local area's past and will learn how technological changes from prehistory to the present day are reflected in the locality. Sherlock Bones

Curriculum links: 🔍

Meet Sherlock Bones our museum detective! Children will learn enquiry skills to uncover the identity of the skeleton discovered in our mock 'burial site'. After removing artefacts and remains from the site, children will have a chance to explore skeletal remains around the museum and use their understanding of the human body and close observation of the remains to find out more about the background of an individual.

KS1 / KS2

Take it Away Clay

Curriculum links:   

Explore sculpture, materials and techniques with our art handling collection. Then create your own individual art work in clay. This workshop can be adapted to respond to our exhibitions or your own topic.

Popping Portraits

Curriculum links:   

Use a variety of printing techniques to create your own individual portrait which lends itself to an eye-catching class display. Learn about Pop Art and the legacy it had on contemporary art and culture.

EYFS Nocturnal

Animals and Habitats

Curriculum links:    

This workshop encourages children to act out an owl inspired story using a range of props, use their artistic skills to create an owl mask and finally investigate other nocturnal animals.

KS2

Shadow Puppet Theatre

Curriculum links:   

Explore the science of light and host your own performance based on your chosen story – either a set text or something brand new. Create your characters and make them come to life through movement and shadows.

KS2

Blue Abyss

Curriculum links:  

This workshop focuses on investigating properties of oil and water based mediums. Children will work on their own underwater themed artwork, using Paul Klee's fish paintings as inspiration.

Outreach

Egyptian Life and Times

Curriculum links: 


Use all your senses to experience Egyptian life and times. Handle replica artefacts, identify and select items for a tomb and mummify a body.

Toy Story

Curriculum links: 

Investigate toys through the ages from the Tudor period to the modern day in this hands-on session. Discover through playing with the toys what they are made of and how they work.

Florence Nightingale

Curriculum links: 

Florence Nightingale will visit your school, bringing along her special travelling trunk full of curious things linked to her time spent in Scutari Hospital. She will invite children to join her in re-enacting her arrival in the Crimea, with help from soldiers, orderlies, nurses and cooks.
